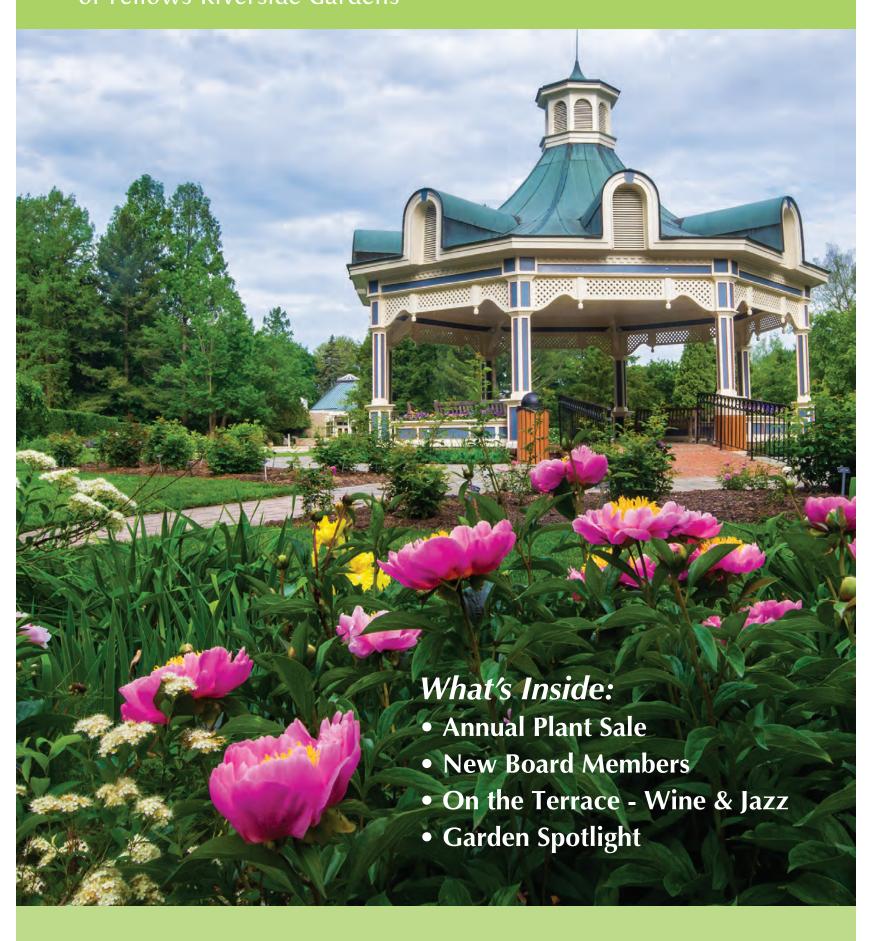

Garden Spotlight - What's Growing? Spring 2021

pring burst onto the scene at Fellows Riverside Gardens with a flash and flourish. The once dull, dusky landscape is now awash with vibrant splashes of reds, yellows, pinks, and purples. Against a lush green canvas, visitors have been enjoying thousands of vibrant spring bulbs such as hyacinth, crocuses, daffodils, and more recently tulips. And doing so while staying safely 6-feet apart from other quests.

As the days grow longer and temperatures hopefully stay warmer, the Gardens will continue to grow and blossom. Sarah Septsios, Garden Supervisor with Mill Creek Metroparks, shared that, "We are currently growing approximately 50,000 annuals to be planted once our beautiful spring display has finished. [There are] 90 roses that we will be planting this spring in the rose garden and gazebo area."

Sarah also shared that the Gardens have some capital improvements that will begin in the coming months. Mill Creek Metroparks has been working with a company to replace large pieces of flagstone on the north and south terraces, both much loved, well-used locations for photographers and families alike.

Lastly, after a year where everything was anything but "usual," Sarah concluded her Garden update by sharing that, "As usual, this time of year we are doing lots of spring cleanup throughout the gardens and are looking forward to the growing season."

Vegetables and Herbs for Sale in May

he Spring Plant Sale has been a tradition at the Gardens---and an important Friends fundraiser---since 1990. Initially held on the North Terrace overlooking the city, the sale has weathered hail, wind, and rainstorms, though inevitably during each Plant Sale the sun emerges, stirring the anticipation of shoppers for yet another promising season of gardening.

This year's Plant Sale is designed to be in step with a more gradual return to community events. Several small-scale weekend sales will replace the sprawling, tented Spring sale of past years. Each sale will be located at several tables outside the Shop in the Gardens, on the terrace leading to the DeYor Concourse and the large fountain. Sale hours are 10 am to 5 pm, Saturday and Sunday. Members will receive discounts on their purchases.

The May 15-16 weekend kicks off the first sale, dedicated to vegetables and herbs. Once again veggie growers Monica Parkhurst and Deb Metzger have planted non-GMO seeds in the Gardens greenhouse during the cold early months. Nearly a dozen varieties of tomatoes---sauce tomatoes and grape tomatoes, favorite varieties of slicing tomatoes, an especially tasty 'Jubilee' tomato---will be ready for ground or container planting.

Varieties of peppers, hot and sweet, some new, some very familiar to shoppers (such as the popular Hungarian Wax variety) have grown into sturdy plants ready for the garden. Shoppers can also buy artichokes and micro-greens.



Pam Baytos, longtime herb guru, has once again ordered a tantalizing array of herbs for the sale---lavender and rosemary, thyme and cilantro, verbena, dill, four kinds of basil, oregano, mint, tarragon, parsley and sage, nasturtium and bay leaf. There will be herb baskets for sale, as well as individual plants.

If you'd like to help with set-up or sales, volunteers are welcome. Cashiers are also needed. Call Deb Metzger at 330-881-0574 for more details.

Stan is the force behind the Dahlia Garden at the northwestern end of Fellows Riverside Gardens. Its colorful splendor is a must-see in late summer.

Dennis is the owner of DJ's Greenhouse in Transfer, Pa., and a popular lecturer about all kinds of plants. Carol, who is a Master Gardener with the Trumbull County Extension Service, is a "perennial person" who has extensive knowledge and love of hostas, ferns, day lilies and ornamental grasses, and both perennial and tropical succulents.

Mill Creek Park Scrapbooks Provide Park Educators with Fun Stories to Tell

id you ever hear the story about the time there were monkeys spotted in the Park?

Neither did MetroParks Educator Lynn Zocolo. She once heard the tale from a guest while giving a trolley tour, but at the time didn't have anything to back it up.

Later she learned there were volumes of old scrapbooks stored in the MetroParks Administration Building and her interest was piqued. After exploring the scrapbooks on site, she was granted permission to move them to the archives at the Davis Center to keep as part of the museum assets housed in the lower level.

The scrapbooks date back to 1921 and mainly include park documents and original news clippings meticulously gathered and organized by date. Labels were added to the covers to make searching go smoother.

"The history of the Park has always intrigued me, and I've found that these scrapbooks tell a wonderful story," she said.

One of those stories is from a 1947 Vindicator clipping where, sure enough, a troop of monkeys was not only spotted in the Park but photographed along with a boy on a bicycle watching nearby. The monkeys, as it turns out, escaped from an exhibit at Idora Park.

Lynn says she uses the scrapbooks for fact-checking and for inspiration for educational content, MetroParks tours and Nature Rocks video segments. It is a treasure hunt through time, she said.

"They often tell a story about the Park that I find interesting enough to want to share with visitors or viewers," she said. "I am always looking for things that might surprise people or make them say 'I didn't know that."

In the future. Lynn envisions preserving these historic treasures and displaying samples of them in the museum cases.
