Thinking Spring with Gardens Staff by Scott Lanz

n January 18, 2019, I met with Gardens Supervisor Rob Chismar, Assistant Gardens Supervisor Sarah Spetsios, and Gardener Marcy Dubec to talk about spring at FRG. The timing seemed incongruous as Youngstown was about to receive more than ten inches of snow over the next two days. However, the staff's preparation for spring had actually begun the previous fall, and they were busy planning, mixing, and potting on the day we met.

Question: So, will visitors to the Gardens see anything new this spring?

Rob: We added a permanent daffodil display on the northwest entrance, so that's new. We also planted a black gum tree, Nyssa sylvatica, on the northern end of the Great Lawn. There are also many new donor plants and shrubs.

Sarah: Also, three new benches were added.

Q: About the new daffodil display, FRG is well known for its varieties of daffodils. How many different kinds are there here?

Rob: We have close to 200 unique cultivars of narcissi.

Q: What do you like best about spring at FRG?

Sarah: For me, it's the bulb display. Last fall, the staff and volunteers planted 39,000 bulbs.

Q: Was this done in a particular color theme or scheme?

Marcy: Yes, we went with warm colors; lots of reds and yellows, with many variations on those colors.

Q: Do you have a personal favorite spring flower?

Rob: For me, probably the Reticulated Iris.

Sarah: I would say hyacinths.

Q: How about favorite trees or shrubs in spring?

Rob: Dwarf Fothergilla. It is in the Witch-hazel family and has small flowers that smell like honey. It is also one of the earliest blooming woody shrubs and is therefore a harbinger of spring, like forsythia.

Sarah: I love any variety redbud.

Marcy: I would say the Milky Way Kousa Dogwood by the Shade Garden, although it blooms a little later in spring. That particular tree is even known nationally. One of the country's leading horticulturalists, Michael Dirr, talks about it in one of his books.

Q: Anything else you would like visitors to know about spring?

Sarah: Only that we are anxiously awaiting it like every-

The Evolution of a Library by Janet Yaniglos





ny visitor to the D.D. and Velma Davis Education & Visitor Center is likely to wander into the Maxcine Antonucci Horticulture Library and then stop short in surprise, struck by its grand, to-the-ceiling windows. Comfy chairs and amazing succulents along the windows draw one to venture closer, to take in the up-close view of the garden landscape. Have not you yourself wandered in and felt the charm of the light-filled space... and then perhaps vowed to return someday to peruse the library's books?

This gem of architectural design was part of the Davis Center's original layout, when it opened in December 2000. John Antonucci funded the construction of the library in memory of his mother Maxcine Antonucci. Seven years later, the Antonucci family and friends sponsored a special evening fundraiser, "The Season of Roses and Wine", which raised \$26,000 to support library operations and the creation of "Mimi's Corner" for children's reading.

Garden Forum Beginnings

The idea of a garden-based library was championed long before, in the 1960's, by the Garden Forum of the Greater Youngstown Area. Many books were donated over the decades to the Fred W. Green Memorial Garden Center at Fellows Riverside Gardens, which closed in August 1999 to make way for construction of the Davis Center. Ever since then, worn older books would find their way into the annual Used Book Sale stacks. Sale profits and individual donations made possible the purchase of increasingly more colorful and photograph-filled books. Funds

New for Children

The western side of the library – Mimi's Corner – is now fully dedicated to encouraging children to linger and experience the magic of reading. All books are shelved at levels easy to reach for little hands. There are child-size beanbag chairs, and Friends has paid for an enticing collection of life-size animal puppets and boxed games for imaginative play.

Also, a few brainstorming sessions have been held among several staff, Friends Board members, and library-lovers (Andrew, Mandy Smith, Carole McWilson, Carol Hart, Denise Stewart, Debbie Liptak and Janet Yaniglos). The group learned that today's libraries are emphasizing programs





to encourage a life-long love of reading, often actively engaging adults who accompany children visitors. It was decided that offering such activities during 2019's cold-weather months would be a good start to boosting use of the library.

So check the calendar for "Crafty Critters" programs, conducted by the MetroParks Education staff. Similar to the outdoor "Family Fun Fridays" during the Gardens' growing season, the hours give adults flexibility in time spent there. Drop in with your favorite little ones for a hands-on craft activity and garden- or natureoriented reading session. Add a stop in the Shop in the Gardens... enjoy lunch in the Garden Café... what a perfect way to spend a few cold weekday hours with a young child!

Stay tuned for further program developments in the library. Andrew's dream is to make technology available there so visitors can tap into information on the garden's plantings – an idea in its very early stages, but perhaps another opportunity for Friends to bring its resources and collaborative support to Fellows Riverside Gardens. And meanwhile, take some time to peruse those library

raised by the much loved Wintertime Teas also helped the collection grow.

This past decade has seen a decline in use of the Gardens library, as people have turned to the internet for horticultural expertise, mirroring national trends. (When was the last time you took time to page through a magazine or check out a book from the Antonucci Library?) That's what drove Gardens Director Andrew Pratt and his staff to take a hard look at ways to make better use of the under utilized library. Last year, he asked the horticultural librarian from the Cleveland Botanical Garden to do a careful

winnowing down of the book collection. with outdated references and worn books directed to the Used Book Sale. The books that remain continue to span the broad array of contemporary horticultural topics. References on gardening techniques, floral arts, botanical gardens, and just about every type of flower and landscape plant fill the book shelves on the eastern side of the library. Andrew is adamant that there will always be a good horticultural reference library at Fellows Riverside Gardens – it's a botanical garden's crucial resource for both staff and the community.


